'He must rise from the dead' Jn 21:1-9

The resurrection gospel narratives show us that Jesus wanted to lead His disciples to transcend the old relationship they had with Him, with its limitations. He wanted them to discover Him in another way, to find a new way of relating to Him. Jesus wanted his disciples to discover Him as the risen Christ, now totally free. He also wants us to discover new life in freedom within ourselves!

One of the questions the disciples had on that first Easter morning was 'If Jesus is not in the tomb, where is he now?' In the light of his appearances to them, they came to understand that he was to be found among themselves, the community of believers. The risen Lord journeys with us, and he wants to journey through us as well; he wants to take flesh in our lives so that we become living signs of his Easter presence. He wants to live in us, so his life-giving love becomes a reality in our world today. We can be grateful this Easter for ways that the Lord's love has taken flesh in the lives of so many people.



# St Mary of Magdala and the Easter Egg

According to tradition, after Jesus' Ascension Mary Magdalene, presented herself to the Emperor Tiberius in Rome to proclaim the resurrection of Jesus Christ, with an egg in hand to illustrate her message. Holding the egg out to him, she exclaimed for the first time what is the universal Easter proclamation among Christians, "Christ is risen!"

The emperor, mocking her, said that Jesus had no more risen than the egg in her hand was red. Immediately, the egg turned red as a sign from God to illustrate the truth of her message. In some iconography we read St Mary Magdalene holding an egg (usually red in colour). Our image of St Mary Magdalene by the artist Richard Stodart, could be used for reflection and prayer with the words; 'He is Risen, Alleluia!'
